**Dr. Kimberly J. Vannest**  
Texas A & M

Dr. Kimberly J. Vannest is currently a Professor, Yates Fellow and Montague Teaching Scholar in the Special Education Program and Department of Educational Psychology at Texas A & M University. Her research broadly covers interventions for students with and at risk of Emotional and Behavioral Disorders, progress monitoring and single case research design. Publishing more than 100 works, and receiving nearly 15 million dollars in research funding, her more nationally known works include the BASC-3 Behavior Intervention Guide; and the Encyclopedia of Special Education. She has developed software programs for progress monitoring in behavior and academics and online single case research calculators. Currently she serves as Chair of the Publications Committee for CCBBD and has held appointments in Division 5 of APA, she is an editorial board member or reviewer for a dozen journals. Current research and funded projects emphasize military-connected children; universal screening programs; effect sizes and moderator-analysis in single case research.

### Parking

If you have a CCSU ID you may use it at the gate to the Downtown Campus garage.

For all others, parking is available in the Municipal Parking Garage in back of the CCSU building (access is on Chestnut St and Bank St, exit is Bank St).

There is short-term, metered parking on Main Street and next to the Police Station.

### Getting There

**From I-84 (Waterbury – East)**  
Exit 35 (left exit) to Route 72 East. Take Exit 9 - Main Street. At end of the exit take a right. At the next light take a right onto Chestnut Street and another right onto Main Street. CCSU is a brick building located on the right just before the first light, next to the Police Station.

### From I-84 (Hartford – West)

Exit 39A to Route 9 South. Take Exit 27 – Chestnut Street (left exit). At the end of the exit take a right onto Chestnut Street and proceed to the third light. Take a right onto Main Street. CCSU brick building located on the right just before the first light, next to the Police Station.

### From the South (Routes 9, 91, or 15)

Go north on Route 9 to Exit 26 – Downtown New Britain. Go straight at the end of the exit, take a left at the following traffic light (CVS is on the corner) onto Chestnut Street. Take your second right onto Main Street. CCSU is a brick building located on the right just before the first light, next to the Police Station.
