Keynote Presentation

Dr. Perry Zirkel

Key Issues in Special Education Law: Present and Future

Perry A. Zirkel is university professor of education and law at Lehigh University, where he formerly was dean of the College of Education and more recently held the Jacocca Chair in Education for its five-year term. He has a Ph.D. in Educational Administration and a J.D. from the University of Connecticut, and a Master of Laws degree from Yale University. He has written more than 1,400 publications on various aspects of school law, with an emphasis on legal issues in special education. He writes a regular column for Principal magazine and did so previously for Phi Delta Kappan and Teaching Exceptional Children. Past president of the Education Law Association and co-chair of the Pennsylvania special education appeals panel from 1990 to 2007, he is the author of the CEC monograph The Legal Meaning of Specific Learning Disability; the more recent books, A Digest of Supreme Court Decisions Affecting Education and Student Teaching and the Law; and the two-volume reference Section 504, the ADA and the Schools, now in its third edition. In 2012, he received Research into Practice Award from the American Educational Research Association (AERA) and the Excellence in Research Award from AERA's Division A (Administration, Organization & Leader-In 2013, he received the University Council for Educational Edwin Bridges award for significant contributions to Administration's the preparation and development of school leaders

National Update of Case Law under the IDEA and Section 504/ADA

This session will be a fast-paced review of an annotated compilation of officially published court decisions under the IDEA and, on a secondary basis, those under Section 504 and its sister statute, the ADA. The emphasis will be on key concepts, significant new developments, and decisions from the Second Circuit and the courts in Connecticut.

Common Misconceptions under the IDEA

This session will identify various prevailing perceptions and practices (i.e., the "lore") about the IDEA that do not square with an objective examination of the law. These items concern 1) child find, evaluation, and eligibility; 2) FAPE; 3) student records; 4) discipline; and 5) remedies.

Common Misconceptions under Section 504 & the ADA

This session will provide a corresponding comparison of the law v. the lore for various student issues under Section 504 and the ADA, including, for example, private school obligations, eligibility, entitlement, and liability.
